Introduction

Genesis 13:1-4

- 1. Abram is back on track by the preserving grace of God
 - Hebrews 3:14—For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end.
 - Philippians 2:13—it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.
- 2. The use of the Hebrew words for "heavy" or "weighty"
 - Ephesians 1:3—Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places,

Genesis 13:5-9

- 1. The Scene
- 2. The Set-Up
- 3. The Servant

IPhilippians 2:5-9—Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,

Genesis 13:10-18

- 1. Lot's Choice
 - Lot lifted up his eyes and Saw a delight to his eyes.
 - Lot Assessed that it was well watered like the garden of God, like the land of Egypt.
 - Lot Takes that land for himself.

2. God's Promise to Abram

(1) The Land that God has given him is far greater.

- (3) The Offspring that God will bless him with will be innumerable
 - Revelation 7:9—After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands,
